The Lynn University Remembrance Plaza

The Lynn University Remembrance Plaza, a permanent tribute to the Lynn students and professors who lost their lives in the 2010 Haiti earthquake, will be located at the heart of campus and bordering the lake adjacent to Lynn's student center, the Lynn Residence Hall and the Schmidt Center.

It will combine symbolic elements of light, water, stone and trees and will be a place of remembrance, reflection and inspiration. In particular, the memorial will include six prisms shimmering with light representing each of the lost individuals; a waterfall that will cascade onto six steps also representing the six and leading to the lake; a relief map of Haiti including the story of the Journey of Hope; and the Royal Palm, the national tree of Haiti.

The Remembrance Plaza was designed by architect Luis Sousa, who also designed Lynn's Perper Plaza and Perper Tennis Complex. Sousa remarked that he wanted to commemorate the past while being inspired by the future. "The plaza embodies the six who were lost while allowing others to reflect."

COMPLETION AND DEDICATION

Although Lynn University does not yet have an official completion or dedication date, an unveiling ceremony is expected to be held in Spring 2012.

ABOUT THE REMEMBRANCE PLAZA FUND

- The university's goal is to raise \$650,000. Over 600 donors have contributed cash, pledges and gifts of service. The university is still accepting donations.
- Donations are welcomed from all alumni, parents and friends, corporations and foundations and from the internal campus community.
- A donor recognition wall will reflect all gifts of \$2,500 and more.
- Pledges of \$25,000 and more may be completed in up to 5 years.
- All donors, at all levels, will be recognized in the dedication program.

About a Journey of Hope – Haiti 2010

On Tuesday, Jan. 12, 2010, a magnitude 7.0 earthquake shook Port-au-Prince, Haiti where twelve Lynn University students and two professors were for a January Term course entitled, “Journey of Hope to Haiti.” The Lynn University group was staying at the Hotel Montana in Port-au-Prince. Eight of the Lynn University students returned home after the quake, but four students and two professors were lost.

Lynn students’ dedication to helping others – feeding the poor, aiding the sick and comforting the hurting – began with the first trip to Haiti in 2008, and their passion spawned the Students for the Poor Club and subsequent missions.

January Term

Lynn University's January Term (J-Term) lasts about 2 weeks and is based on experiential learning opportunities – learning by doing. J-term is required of all traditional undergraduate students. Students can select a course outside of the focus of their majors and opt for any J-Term course.

Journey of Hope to Haiti 2010 Course Description

Prior to departure, the students met on campus for two lead-up sessions that investigated countries in need, the humanitarian organizations in place to help those countries, and what individuals can do to support the humanitarian organizations. During the trip to Haiti with Food for the Poor, students were scheduled to visit and provide activities to orphans and handicapped children, adults and the elderly. They also were to paint houses. Students were to explore this complex country during a trip that was designed to examine economic and cultural diversity only experienced by seeing it firsthand. Students were told, "Surrounded by the hungriest and poorest people in the world, you will experience kindness and beauty that will make you question everything you believe in and appreciate everything you take for granted."

About Lynn University Haiti Funds and Scholarships

1. The Stephanie Crispinelli Endowed Memorial Scholarship

The scholarship will be awarded to students who emulate Steph's enthusiasm for reaching out to help others and commit themselves to responsible citizenship in our global society. The funds will provide tuition and travel assistance for selected students who wish to participate in humanitarian courses approved and sponsored by Lynn. As an endowed fund, this scholarship will live on in perpetuity.

- Three students received funds to go on the 2012 J-Term "Bali Service Project" where students will engage in service projects with local elementary schools in Bali, Indonesia and learn about Balinese culture, geography and history.

2. The Christine Gianacaci Journey of Hope Award

Christine Gianacaci's parents, in honor of Christine's life and love to help others, especially children, created the award.

- This award helped fund four students' travel costs for the 2012 J-Term to Brazil where they will learn about issues related to poverty, nutrition, access to health care and housing by exploring local culture, engaging local citizens and interacting with school children.

3. Briggs Family Haitian Scholarship for earthquake survivor

The Briggs family wished to provide tuition for a student from a Haitian university whose education had been interrupted by the earthquake.

- Gwendoline Darguste, a 21-year-old sophomore majoring in international relations, was identified through the Haitian Embassy and the U.S. Department of Education.
