Command your career

There's only one way to go when you've got an interest in aviation, and the Burton D. Morgan School of Aeronautics is prepared to take you all the way up with the following eight certificates and ratings:

- **Airline Transport Pilot** – This certificate requires 1,500 logged flight hours—which will give you plenty of time to acquire the skill and comfort level you'll need as pilot-in-command on large-scale commercial flights. Prerequisites for this certificate include a current commercial pilot license.
- **Boeing B727 Familiarization** – Gear up to take on this mid-size aircraft. This certificate will introduce you to aircraft specifications, systems and handling procedures necessary to fly a Boeing B727.
- **Certified Flight Instructor** – Log hours, experience and income as a flight instructor. Prerequisites for this certification include obtaining your private pilot's license and commercial/instrument pilot ratings.
- **Commercial Pilot** – It's not a job if you don't get paid—and a commercial pilot certificate allows you to do just that. With this certificate, you can charge for your piloting services. Prerequisites for this certificate include obtaining your private pilot license and instrument rating.
- **Instrument Pilot Rating** – This rating will help you learn to trust your instruments—and will allow you to fly at night and in imperfect weather. You must have a valid private pilot license to enter this certificate program.
- **Private Pilot** – Get licensed to fly! This FAA-issued license is your first step in your pursuit of a hobby or future career in the clouds. You must have a current, valid FAA medical to earn this certificate.
- **Professional Commercial Pilot** – Prepare for a truly professional career as a paid pilot with this certificate. This certificate includes all training for the commercial and instrument pilot licenses.
- **Recurrent Flight Training** – Satisfy the FAA-required 24-month flight review with this certificate, and secure your claim as a professional pilot at the same time. You must have a valid pilot license to enroll in this certificate program.
