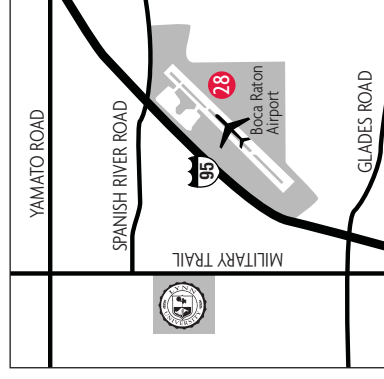
# LYNN UNIVERSITY CAMPUS MAP

Turn right at the last right before the overpass. Go straight to the "T" in the road (20 feet) and turn left. Go forward 20 feet; the parking lot is now off to your right. ## THINGS TO REMEMBER

- Have your travel documents in order and confirmed with the Office of International Student Life before the check-in date.
- Request the correct visa (F-1) at the U.S. Embassy or Consulate in your home country.
- Make arrangements to have U.S. currency available upon arrival to the United States.
- The U.S. Immigration officer at the port of entry will place a red date stamp on the student copy of your SEVIS I-20 and return it to you. They will also place a red stamp with the initials D/S on your I-94 (Departure Record).

**IMPORTANT:** IF THE OFFICER AT THE PORT OF ENTRY ISSUES YOU AN I-515 FORM, PLEASE BRING THIS FORM, YOUR PASSPORT AND YOUR I-94 CARD (ISSUED FOR 30 DAYS) TO OUR OFFICE. THIS IS AN URGENT MATTER THAT NEEDS PROMPT ATTENTION.

### IMMUNIZATION POLICY

Pursuant to Florida Board of Governors Regulation 6.001(9), prior to registration, each student accepted for admission at Lynn University must submit a signed LU Immunization Form. Lynn University requires documented proof of immunizations to Measles and Rubella. In addition, pursuant to Florida Board of Governors Regulations 6.007, effective July 1, 2008, all new matriculating students must also provide documentation of vaccinations against Meningococcal Meningitis and Hepatitis B or provide a signed waiver for each declined vaccination.

#### MANDATORY

You will not be allowed to register without completion of this form and proof of immunity.

### ACCEPTABLE DOCUMENTATION IS AS FOLLOWS:

#### MMR (MEASLES, MUMPS, AND RUBELLA):

Students can be considered compliant for measles only if they have official documentation of at least one of the following:

1. Immunization with **TWO (2) DOSES** of MMR virus vaccine\* on **or after the first birthday and at least 28 days apart**. Persons vaccinated with killed or unknown vaccine **prior to 1968** must be revaccinated.
2. Laboratory (serologic) evidence of measles immunity.
3. A written, dated statement, signed by a physician on his/her stationery, that specifies the date seen and stating that the person has had an illness characterized by a generalized rash lasting three (3) or more days, a fever of 101 degrees Fahrenheit or greater, a cough and conjunctivitis, and, in the physician's opinion, is diagnosed to have had the ten-day measles (rubeola).

**\* PLEASE NOTE: ALL FEMALE STUDENTS SHOULD BE AWARE THAT THEY SHOULD NOT BE VACCINATED WITH A LIVE VIRUS VACCINE IF THERE IS ANY POSSIBILITY OF PREGNANCY.**

#### MENINGOCOCCAL MENINGITIS:

Students can be considered compliant for meningitis only if they have documentation of at least one of the following:

1. Documentation of immunization with **ONE (1) DOSE** of meningococcal meningitis vaccine. (mandatory for residential students)
2. A signed waiver declining the vaccine (See Section B). (This option applies to commuter students only)

#### HEPATITIS B:

Students can be considered compliant for hepatitis B only if they have documentation of at least one of the following:

1. Official documentation of immunization with **THREE (3) DOSES** of hepatitis B vaccine in accordance with the CDC Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices.
2. Laboratory (serologic) evidence of hepatitis B immunity (positive hepatitis surface antibody).
3. A signed waiver declining the vaccine (See Section B).

#### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

In order to be considered official, this form must contain a signature of authorizing person AND an office stamp. Copies of official records may be attached and must include the student's name and front cover of all documents. Any changes, additions, write overs, use of different ink/handwriting or use of white-out must be re-signed by the authorizing person providing proof. We reserve the right to interpret the validity of all documents. Any attached immunization records must be in English or an official translation or they will not be accepted.

### IMPORTANT

#### IMMUNIZATION INFORMATION FOR ALL LYNN UNIVERSITY STUDENTS

Many extremely valuable vaccines are available to help prevent certain diseases. Preventing any of the following diseases is highly desirable and is best accomplished with vaccinations. Measles, mumps, rubella (MMR), hepatitis B and meningococcal meningitis (Menactra) vaccines are available to prospective students, prior to registration, at the Health Center.

**Meningococcal meningitis** is a rare bacterial infection of the membranes surrounding the brain and spinal cord. It can cause severe neurological damage, loss of limbs, or death. The vaccine Menactra protects 90% of its recipients against four of the five serotypes of bacteria which cause this form of meningitis. Protection is believed to last for a minimum of eight years. People with a history of latex allergy, Guillain-Barré syndrome, or previous serious allergic reaction to Menactra should not receive the vaccine. Pregnant women must consult with their physicians prior to receiving Menactra.

**Hepatitis B** is a serious viral liver disease that can lead to chronic liver disease, liver cancer, or rarely, death. Hepatitis B vaccine is believed to confer life-long immunity in most cases. People with a history of life-threatening reaction to baker's yeast or to a previous dose of hepatitis B vaccine should not receive the vaccine. Pregnant women may be vaccinated.

**Measles** is a highly contagious viral infection that can cause ear infection, pneumonia, seizures, brain damage or even death. Pregnant women and people who have ever had a life-threatening reaction to gelatin, neomycin or a previous dose of MMR vaccine should not receive the MMR vaccine.

**Mumps** is a contagious disease that is caused by the mumps virus. Mumps typically starts with a few days of fever; headache, muscle aches, tiredness, and loss of appetite, and is followed by swelling of salivary glands. Anyone who is not immune from either previous mumps infection or from vaccination can get mumps.

**Rubella** is a contagious viral infection that causes a rash, mild fever and stiff joints in adults. A pregnant woman who contracts rubella could have a miscarriage or her baby could be born with serious birth defects. Two doses of MMR vaccine can provide long-term, effective protection against these diseases. Anyone who has one of the following should consult with a physician prior to receiving the MMR vaccine: HIV/AIDS or other diseases of the immune system; cancer or is receiving cancer treatment; blood disorders or recent receipt of blood transfusions or blood products. Pregnant women and people who have ever had a life-threatening reaction to gelatin, neomycin or a previous dose of MMR vaccine should not receive the MMR vaccine.

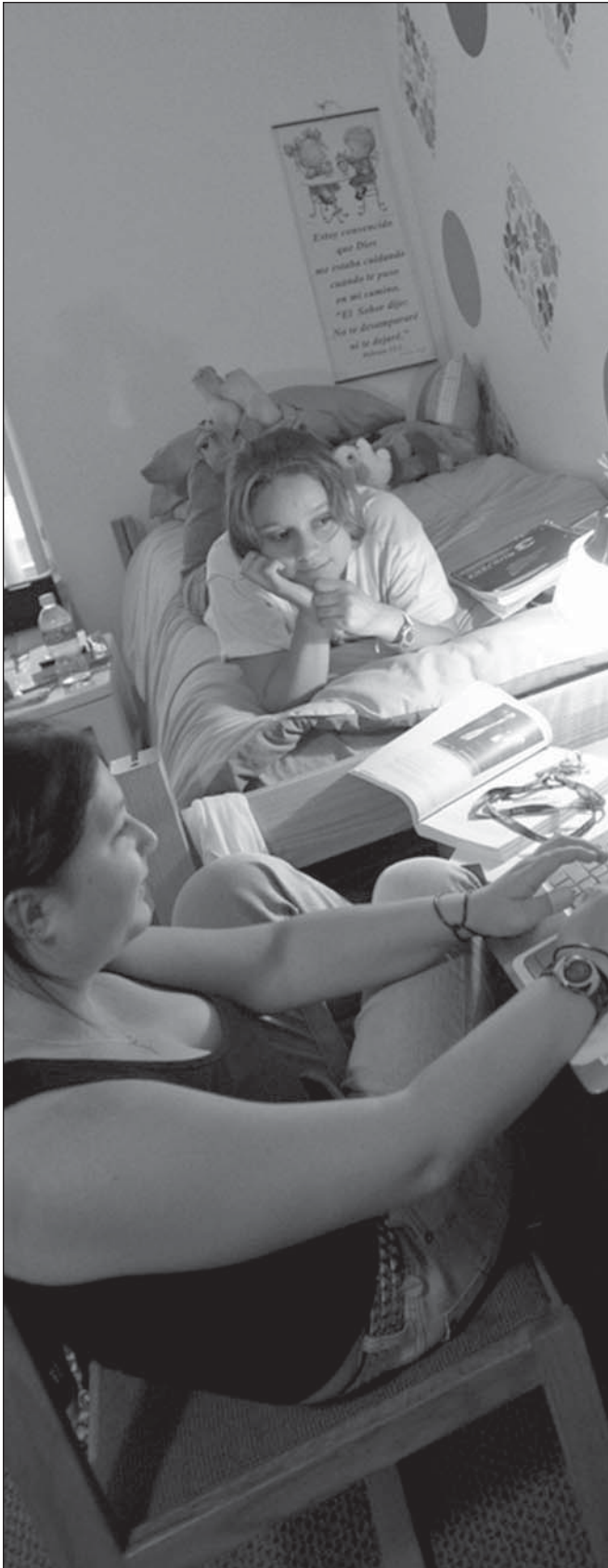

As a residential campus Lynn University requires all students to live in campus housing. Exceptions to this policy are:

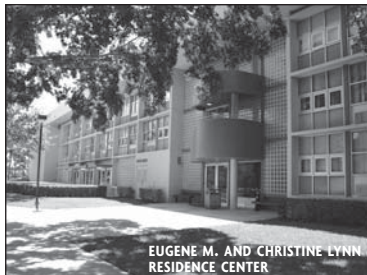
1. Students who are married and/or have children

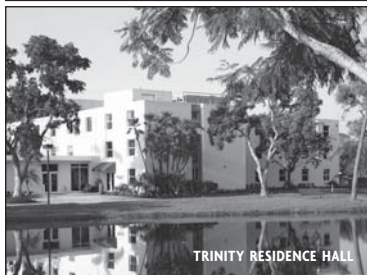
## **The E.M. Lynn Residence Center**

The purpose of Healthy Lifestyles is to offer a residential environment that provides an atmosphere committed to living healthier and making positive life choices. The residents are expected to participate in a healthy lifestyle, including making safe and educated decisions regarding tobacco, alcohol, and drug use.
- I am a conservatory student. Students studying in the Conservatory of Music program will live in deHoernle Residence Hall. The purpose of this agreement is to establish a mutual understanding between the student and the university with regard to living in Lynn University's residential community and is not intended to create a landlord/tenant relationship. This agreement must be completed and all fees paid in full prior to your room assignment.



## **A. TERMS OF THIS AGREEMENT**

This agreement is for a space in the university residential system, and covers the entire 2012-2013 academic year (fall, January, and spring terms), or any portion of the academic year remaining at the time this agreement is signed.

The student is entitled to the use of the assigned room (with exception stated in B.6) and the use of residential facilities. Private rooms are extremely limited in number.

This agreement is in effect from the time it is accepted by the university with appropriate signatures and receipt of the required payment until the end of the student's stay on campus. If the student withdraws from the university, then re-enrolls during this agreement period, the contract obligation will be reinstated. The student must vacate the residence hall within 24 hours of withdrawal during a given academic term.

The university's acceptance of the agreement does NOT guarantee assignment to a certain type of accommodation or specific request.

Residents of Lynn University housing must be enrolled in a minimum of 9 credit hours and registered for classes at Lynn University for the entire term of occupancy. The student must vacate the residence hall within 24 hours of losing full-time student status during a given academic term.

Room charges cover occupancy from date and time designated for official opening until the date and time for official closing of the residential halls, with the exception of winter break vacation when all residence halls will be closed.

All students living in university residence halls are required to participate in the university board (meal) plan.

## **B. CONDITIONS OF ROOM ASSIGNMENT**

Occupancy of rooms is limited to the student(s) to whom the room is assigned. Rooms may not be sublet to another person. Room transfer may be made only after written approval from the Office of Housing and Residence Life.

Students are responsible for care of rooms, furniture, and equipment. The university provides no housekeeping service in the student rooms. Charges may be made for unauthorized use of, or alterations to rooms, equipment or buildings and for special cleaning necessitated by improper care of rooms or equipment. Public areas are those available for use by all students living within a residence hall. Charges will be billed to students for damages to public area as appropriate. The student is responsible for leaving the residence hall room in the same condition as it was at check in.

Students are responsible for knowing and observing university regulations and procedures as set forth in official university publications including the Student Handbook. The university reserves the right to make such rules and regulations that may be necessary for the safety, care, and cleanliness of the premises and for the preservation of the good order. The student agrees to abide by all such additional rules and regulations which are adopted.

The university is not liable for damage or loss/theft of personal property, failure or interruption of utilities, or injury to persons. Students are strongly encouraged to purchase property loss insurance.

Authorized university personnel may enter a student's room for normal inspection and maintenance purposes. The student's personal property is not subject to search without the express approval of the student, except when a reasonable belief exists that the room is being used for a purpose which is illegal or which would otherwise seriously interfere with discipline and/or personal safety.

Room assignments may be changed, canceled or terminated by the university in the interest of order, health, community welfare, and consolidation of space. Disregard for the rights, responsibilities and duties of others, and inappropriate behavior are reasons for possible assignment changes.



**B. CONDITIONS OF ROOM ASSIGNMENT (CONTINUED)**

Visitation shall be in accordance with the guidelines stipulated by the Code of Conduct.

Room assignments are made in accordance with the non-discriminatory policy of the university. Room assignments are not made on the basis of race, religion, color, national and ethnic origin, disability, or age.

A student who moves from his/her originally assigned room at any point during the academic year will be responsible for any difference in price of the new room.

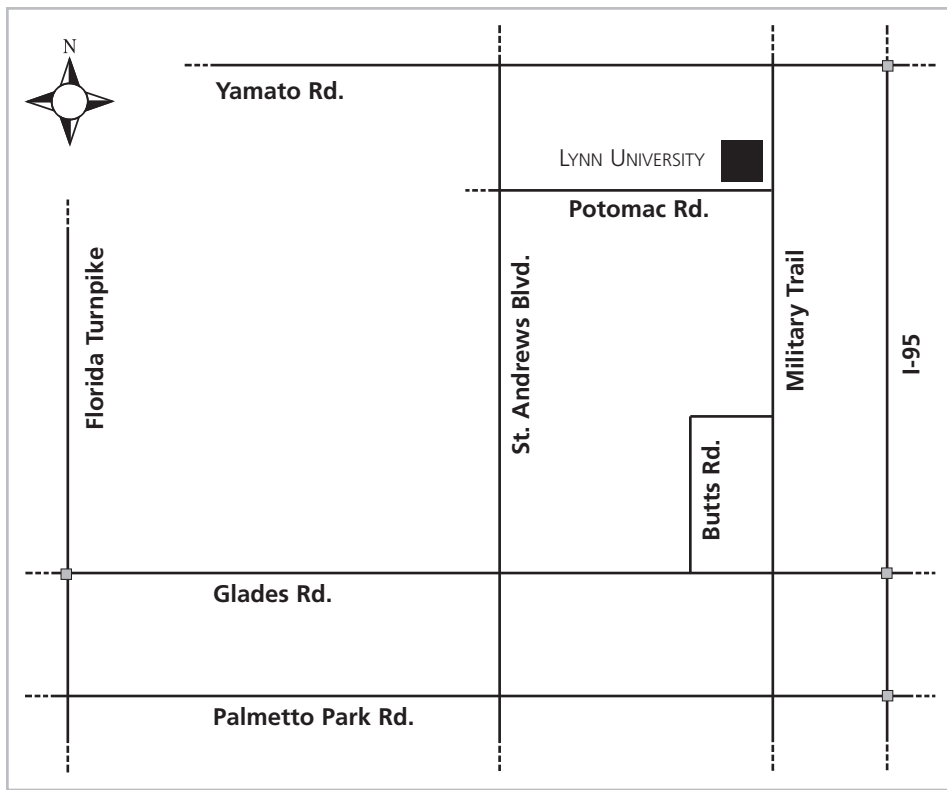
